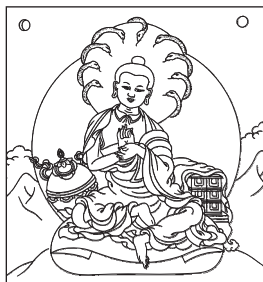


# TEACHINGS ON THE GUHYASAMAJA COMPLETION-STAGE PRACTICES

August 13 - 21, 2011 New York City

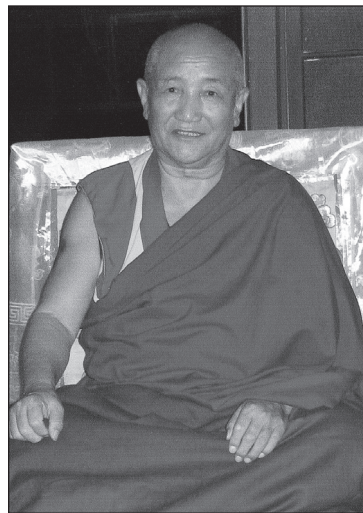

Do Ngak Kunphen Ling and the Mahayana Sutra and Tantra Center are pleased to announce an extraordinary nine-day teaching by Gyumed Khensur Lobsang Jampa Rinpoche on Arya Nagarjuna's *Five Stages (Pañcakrama)*, a verse commentary on the completion-stage practices contained in the Guhyasamaja root and explanatory tantras. The teaching will take place in New York City from August 13 to August 21, 2011, and is open to those who have received an Anuttarayoga Tantra initiation.

Gyumed Khensur Lobsang Jampa Rinpoche was born in Lhasa, Tibet in 1937. He entered the Sera Mey College of Sera Monastery at the age of ten and studied there until 1959. After fleeing to India following the March 10 uprising in Lhasa, he resumed his religious training there, first at Buxar in West Bengal and then in South India in 1970 when the exile seat of Sera Monastery was established at the Bylakuppe Tibetan Settlement. In 1986 he was awarded the Geshe Lharampa degree, which recognizes mastery of all areas of Buddhist philosophical doctrine. After this, he entered Gyumed Tantric College, near the town of Hunsur in the Mysore District of Karnataka State. Upon completion of his tantric studies, he held both the positions of Gekö – or Proctor – and Lama Umdze, the leader that presides over the daily Tantric rituals. In November 1996, His Holiness the Dalai Lama appointed him as Khenpo, or Abbot, a position which he held for 3 years. During this period, he taught all the Tantric subjects extensively.



He first visited the U.S. and Canada in 1996. He has been a visiting lama at the Guhyasamaja Center in the Washington, D.C. area for five years. He now resides at his center, Do Ngak Kunphen Ling in Redding, Connecticut. Highly qualified in all levels of Buddhist doctrine and meditation practice, he is a living example of Buddha's teachings.
